
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Reaching Them Where They Are



argeting a specific demographic is the 'key' to marketing. At InnerVisions, our mission is to empower women and protect life. So how do we reach women who are dealing with what is to them...an unplanned and inconvenient pregnancy? We've spent the last 5 years facing that challenge. "How do people know that InnerVisions exists?"

Tami Bixby, a founding board member, serves as our Director of Marketing. Connecting with an 18-34 year old has become an increasingly difficult task, but Tami has accepted this challenge to help the clinic stay at the forefront of this everchanging industry.

After gathering several years of data, we determined to make some dramatic changes, and so in 2016, we created our most detailed strategic plan, which includes a new website (with a "text us" feature), a deeper SEO

(search engine optimization), and a more strategic use of digital marketing. By March, we experienced more than 75% increase in patient traffic over any other month since opening in 2011.

With Tami's help, we utilize a combination of traditional efforts (billboards & radio), non-traditional efforts (digital & internet), as well as some grassroots marketing.

Tami has helped us better understand our audience: not only the woman in need, but

also her boyfriend who is unsure of his role. We want to be inclusive for all those affected by this "surprise". IVHCare educates, serves, and supports sexually active teens and adults who are clueless about their risky behavior. We are about loving them where they are and speaking a language that sounds familiar to them in order to remain relevant. The pictured ad is an example of a popular app called Tinder, which is a location-based "dating" service where users swipe right for a good match and left to move on to another option. The new ad is creative and speaks their lingo.

We are grateful for our benefactors who have helped to make our marketing resources, strategies, and creativity possible. The digital space is all about owning "real estate" on their mobile devices. Would you consider helping us connect with those who are need help?
