Important Partnerships Are a Blessing



In this ministry we often find ourselves on an emotional roller coaster. As a staff we need all the encouragement we can get, and we rely on others who share the same challenges. Last spring we teamed Director of lc Clinic in Stuart, Iowa. lc Clinic is a medical clinic much like ours. Ruth and three of InnerVisions' registered nurses came together for a comprehensive

ultrasound training program. Combining our resources, we shared a professional trainer who spent about 3 days in the clinic educating the nurses on limited prenatal ultrasounds. Following that training, the nurses then met several evenings and weekends to fulfill the practical experience component of their training by providing approximately 50 free ultrasounds to pregnant women who volunteered as models. The nurses were able to 'practice' their new skills in preparation for serving abortion-minded clients. Our nurses benefited greatly by spending this time with Ruth and her staff, sharing scenarios and encouraging one another.

We've also partnered with Pathways of Pella, a pregnancy center in Pella, Iowa. Pathways has entrusted a number of their clients to us over the past $3\frac{1}{9}$ years. They have referred clients for lifesaving ultrasounds, options counseling, STD testing and Sexual Integrity education.

We are blessed to call them friends and partners. up with Ruth Fennessey, Executive In October, Pathways of Pella hosted their annual fall fundraising banquet and invited me to serve as their keynote speaker. In working with the director, Marilyn Van Mersbergen, we settled on a message of hope — first discussing the sanctity of life and the journey our nation has been on for the past 150 years. I closed my message by challenging the guests to a 'greater call to serve' in the prolife movement encouraging them to take their passion to help women in crisis to the next level...whatever that may be for them. Thank you for being our partner...for trusting us with your children...and for standing strong to defend the sanctity of life in Iowa.

Iowa Nurses FOR LIFE

InnerVisions is pleased to announce the formation of a pro-life nurses network. The lowa Nurses for Life (INFL) group is designed to help nurses and other healthcare workers get the support they need and network with other like-minded healthcare professionals.

"We need more nurses to know about the culture we are in here in lowa" states one nurse, "Nursing is a very liberal field...The culture of death is in every aspect of the field and with some states legalizing euthanasia the culture will get worse before it gets better." Sometimes, she maintains, the pro-life view is labeled more as a sentiment that is "not compassionate or understanding of the person's situation."

This makes it hard to be outspokenly pro-life as "pro-life views aren't common in many healthcare settings" according to Melanie Froyen, the clinic's Director of Nursing. There aren't any other groups with a like mindset in Iowa, according to Melanie and it seems like a good time to get such a group started.

The group members will determine what they need and the direction the group will take. By facilitating INFL InnerVisions hopes to educate and to help articulate the pro-life message more effectively.

As the group progresses Melanie Froyen hopes the group will be able to offer C.E.U.'s to its members and others who join them for conferences or seminars.

A "meet and greet" at the clinic on Monday, October 20th featured Jennifer Bowen of Iowa Right to Life, a tour of the clinic and an opportunity for participants to see how InnerVisions fulfills its mission to bring the pro-life message to the clients it serves.

Coming to InnerVisions changed how Susan saw her options. With the love and support she received from the staff at the clinic, Susan was able to see another way out — a way that included life for her baby.

With support of her family, Susan chose adoption for her baby. Support and counseling from the InnerVisions staff has helped Susan see ways to work around and through many of the obstacles that she felt made an abortion her only option. Through the generosity of some of InnerVision's donors many of Susan's

financial hardships were alleviated. In addition, the staff continues to support Susan in her search for work and housing.

Susan continues to be amazed and grateful for the support she received not only that hot June day, but ever since. Regular phone calls and visits from Jenny and volunteer staff to see how she is doing have helped Susan keep her spirits up during an undeniably tough time in

Now, Susan sees herself as a strong young woman who, by choosing life for her baby, knows she is answering the fervent prayer for a couple unable to have their own. She feels good about that and rightly so. She has hope for the future as obstacles are turned into opportunities and looks forward to supporting herself and her other two children. She hopes to further her education and wants to help others who are dealing with circumstances similar to those she found herself in a few months ago. Baby Blankets Made With Love at St. Luke's

Some have been a small quilt pieced together by a loving grandma or an afghan crocheted by a dear aunt. Some are bought, but chosen lovingly, making sure they are soft and will cuddle the new little one. They are symbolic of our love and dreams for the tiny life. No matter what name it goes by or where it comes from, the baby blanket is an enduring and endearing symbol of childhood. Some blankets make it well into adulthood, and as ragged and tattered as they may be, they are cherished all the more.



Unfortunately, for many of the women facing unplanned pregnancies who come to InnerVisions, that is simply not their reality. Hopes and dreams are constantly being challenged by fears and insecurities. Many feel isolated and alone and look to the future with trepidation. They don't always have family support and can be in dire financial straits. Satin edged blankets take a backseat to diapers, formula and paving rent.

That's where Cindy Clefisch and more than seventy-five of the students from Religious Education at St. Luke the

t can go by blankie, silky, booboo, lovey, or another name. Evangelist in Ankeny decided to help. They knew they couldn't solve all of the problems these women face, but they could definitely help with the blankets.

Clefisch, the Director of Religious Education at St. Luke's, knew of InnerVisions mission to help empower women to choose life for their babies. She knew those babies and their mothers need to know there is a much wider community that supports their life affirming decision. Clefisch also wanted her students to take part in a service project and give something of themselves to those who needed it most. So, they made wonderful, warm soft fleece blankets for mom, for baby, or for an older sibling.

The students, from 2nd to 10th grades, brought in fleece or money to buy fleece. Clefisch said she had explained InnerVisions' mission to the children and they were excited to do their part. It became their Advent Service Project. The last class before Christmas they put on some Christmas music and got to work. "They loved it," Clefisch said. "They took it very seriously. It was really wonderful." Some cut, some tied, but they all worked together to make a little piece of hope for an expectant mom. And then, when they were done, they gave each blanket the most beautiful finishing touch. They blessed them. Every student who worked on a blanket stood together and prayed a prayer composed by Clefisch for the occasion over the blanket they had just made. They prayed for the baby, they prayed for the mom and asked God's blessing be with them both. Then they entrusted the blankets to InnerVisions to get them to those who need them most. They may never know the baby who cherishes their blanket. They may never know the gratitude of a mother who sees her baby warm and snug in their blanket, but they can be sure that in their work and in their prayer they have helped to answer the prayers of a mother.
